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In the Gospels, forgiveness is also always accompanied by an attempt at reconciliation and personal healing. It also includes unconditional love (Greek, *agape*), the love of our God who makes his sun and rain to fall on good and bad alike. Forgiveness in the Gospels, as with God, must include not just overlooking the wrong done, but an attempt to bring back the wrongdoer. The parables of the good shepherd and his lost sheep, the woman and her lost coin, the loving father and his prodigal son tell us how God acts—and how we, too, should act.

It is important to note at this point that our faith is not simply a question of good and bad actions, but of relationships. Forgiveness is not about undoing evil actions (“What is done is done and cannot be undone.”), but of restoring broken relationships, about healing and reconciliation.
